PACC AGM



The PACC AGM looked back on the period Oct 2023 – Nov 2024. It was held at the Shropshire Wildlife Trust Buildings in Shrewsbury on 21st March 2025.

A summary of the Annual Report was shared with those who attended. The full Annual Report for the period will be published soon and the audited accounts will be available on the Charity Commission website. You can read the summary of the Annual Report <u>here</u>

It has been a very busy and, in many ways, a positive year, with achievements in all three of PACC's core works areas; Influence & Change, Information Provision and Community Support. There are challenges however in embedding coproduction throughout the Shropshire SEND System and ensuring that parent carer voices are truly at the heart of decision making. PACC will continue to work to address this.



Department of Education Funding







The Department For Education has announced new funding totalling £750million to create an additional 10,000 new school places for children with SEND. The funding will be used to deliver adaptations, expand specialist units in mainstream, as well as create new places in special schools.

Guidance has been issued today for Local Authorities on how this additional funding can be used. Suggested types of works are;

- The creation of SEN units and resource provision: These are specialist provisions within mainstream schools to support inclusion.
- Mainstream adaptions and improvements: Accessible toilets, improved acoustic and lighting and creating spaces for re-regulation for example.
- Assistive Technology: Such as scanning pens or dictation software.
- Special school expansions: includes Post 16 specialist provision





ELSEC Update



Early Language Support for Every Child is an initiative from the Department for Education to help promote improved early interventions for children who demonstrate language and communication difficulties. PACC sit on the steering group for this work as we recognise that many children with SEND may benefit from this support offer. We also recognise there will be proportion of children where there needs will surpass this support offer and they will need more targeted, and specialist support made available to them. This work falls into the Change Programme activity Shropshire has been part of.

Understanding the Impact of the Government's Welfare Reform Green Paper on Families with SEND



"The cuts to disability benefits announced by the government today are worse than we feared. The safety net for families with disabled young adults was already seriously strained and now feels like it has been ripped away."

The Government has introduced a Welfare Reform Green Paper that could bring significant changes to benefits and support systems. These proposals may have a direct impact on Parent Carers of children or young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). It is important to understand these changes and how they may affect your family's financial and social wellbeing.





SEND and Alternative Provision Survey



This survey aims to provide the system with information and intelligence about the impact they are having on the areas of concern raised in the Ofsted CQC inspection of 2020 and the reinspection that followed shortly after.

These areas were quality and timeliness of EHCPs, assessment and diagnostic timescales for Autism and ADHD pathways, and the assessment timescales for Speech Language and Communication services.

To date, PACC have participated in workstreams and contributed to many discussions supporting improvements across these areas. The Neurodiversity Practitioners were developed and employed as a role to improve the experience of families awaiting diagnostic assessment of Autism and ADHD. They provide crucial support and guidance to schools and young people to help ensure their needs are suitably met. The Speech and Language helpline, Talkboost communications resource and intervention package, and the ongoing improvement to information about communication skills has been influenced by PACC reps participation in discussions seeking ways to provide triage and support options across Shropshire.



Phase Transfer to post-16 education

Phase transfer deadline: 31 March

For children and young people with EHC plans transferring from secondary school to a post-16 institution



If your child has an EHC plan and they are transferring from secondary school to a post-16 institution this year, the deadline for your local authority to review and amend your child's EHC plan is Monday 31st March.

This deadline is statutory, not optional.

If you have still not received an amended plan, IPSEA have useful information including templates on their website.

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Shropshire **Universal Autism Support Service**

Shropshire Universal Autism Support project offers a unique approach to supporting the emotional well-being of autistic children and young people. The service is almed at families of autistic young people aged 0-19 and provides early intervention & prevention of person centred, needs led support, contributing to improving the understanding of autism, provision of support strategies & information to improve quality f life, no diagnosis is necessary to access this support.



Shropshire Council have announced that the national charity Kids, have been awarded the contract to deliver the Shropshire Universal Autism Support Service from 1st April 2025. This is the service previously delivered by Autism West Midlands.

Kids will continue to offer support to families without the need for a formal diagnosis and positively the age range for the service has been increased by 1 year to 0-19 years. The services will also provide training for Shropshire practitioners to increase the understanding of autism and how to effectively support autistic children and young people and their families.






NeuroFriends Oswestry's Neurodivergent peer to peer group.
