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
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Enquiries


During Term 1 of Year 2, PFA Navigators have had contact with 157 Parent Carers.

This has included 1:1 Teams calls, signposting on social media, responding to email enquiries, face to face conversations at events and speaking to parent carers at community support activities hosted by PACC.


The age range of children and young people that Parent Carers have contacted PFA Navigators regarding is 14-25 years:



Diagnosis of children and young people this included Autism; Learning disability; Down Syndrome; Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH); ADHD and GDD.



Education Provision of Children and Young People includes Mainstream and Specialist school, Mainstream and Specialist College or Not in Education.



Number of sessions delivered

1:1 Calls:

• 26 1:1 Teams calls (19 known to PACC/ Buddies)

Community Support:

- 21 Parent Carers attended and EHCP Masterclass that Navigators held with IPSEA (14 known to PACC/Buddies)
- 19 Parent Carers attended a Christmas disco with CYP aged 14-25 (18 known to PACC/Buddies)
- 12 Parent Carers and CYP attended 2 yoga sessions (12 known to PACC/ Buddies)
- 17 Parent Carers and CYP aged 14-25 attended the SEND Santa experience (7 known to PACC/ Buddies)
- 40 attendees at Half-Term activities (37 Known to PACC/ Buddies)
- 22 attendees at Healthy Lives Programme Celebration event (22 Known to PACC/ Buddies)



This Term, Navigators have engaged with 129 Parent Carers known to PACC and 28 new Parent Carers.

Through Creating relationships within the Shropshire SEND community to create Community Support opportunities for young people aged 14-25 and their Parent Carers, PACC were delighted to have been invited to Rock! Music Schools "Jingle Bell Rock" Concert, where proceeds from the concert were donated to PACC.

Key Issues and Themes

- **EHCP's-** Information is outdated, Reports from professionals over 6 years old and not a true reflection on CY, EHCP's not being adhered to in education provision, parent carers unaware of PFA annual review and how this differs from previous reviews, following reviews EHCP's are not being returned within time scales.
- EHCP's Ceasing- It was highlighted following the EHCP Masterclass that Parent Carers
 were being advised young people's EHCP's would cease following completion of a
 supported internship- IPSEA clarified that an EHCP could not be ceased if the young
 person did not move into full time employment or decided to not continue with
 education.
- **Social Opportunities-** Lack of information available to parent carers about opportunities and how to access the correct level of support for CYP to participate.
- **Direct Payments** Parent Carers not receiving clear information, PA rates not being xplained, criteria for DP's unclear.
- Mental Health Support for Parent Carers: This term we have had a number of parent carers contact who are in crisis, with limited or no support from family or friends.
- Mental Health support for CYP: Parent Carers unclear of the process to get support through BeeU, Schools not clear on how to support mental health needs if they are presented differently in school to how parent carer describes.
- **Mental Capacity:** Parent Carers unsure of this area, how to approach and what they need to do.
- **Benefits and finances:** Unsure of changes that happen at 16 and eligibility for certain benefits.

Plan for Next Quarter

- Continue to develop relationships with Schools and post 16 education providers.
- Schedule monthly evening 'drop-in' Teams calls.
- Training event on Mental Capacity, Deputyship and Finances scheduled for February.
- Finalise EHCP Resource book.
